




Historically Abundant, Currently Extirpated


- Historical estimates in Lake Erie: ~300,000 1.2 million adults
 - 19 spawning populations
 - Only 2 currently exist: Detroit River & Niagara River
- Prior to 1850, abundant in the Maumee River
 - "Sturgeon once ran up the river by the hundreds as far as the rapids above Perrysburg..." (Smith & Snell 1891)
- Considered "absent" in Fishes of Ohio, by Milton B. Trautman (1981)
- Currently considered extirpated (Holey et al. 2000)
- Currently no evidence of spawning or recruitment (Boase 2008, Mapes et al. 2015)
- Unlikely to repopulate without intervention






Lake Erie Population Status

Historically 19 spawning populations (2008)






